ANNUAL WATER QUALITY REPORT AVAILABLE

North Weld County Water District is committed to providing safe, high-quality drinking water to our customers. Each year, we publish our Annual Water Quality Report, also known as the Consumer Confidence Report (CCR), to keep you informed about your water. The report includes information on your water source, water quality testing results, detected contaminants (if any), and how the District meets or exceeds all state and federal drinking water standards.

2025 ANNUAL FINANCIAL AUDIT AVAILABLE

Transparency and responsible financial stewardship are priorities at North Weld County Water District. Our 2025 Annual Financial Audit, performed by an independent certified public accounting firm, provides an objective review of the District's financial statements and accounting practices. The audit helps ensure public funds are managed responsibly while demonstrating our commitment to accountability, sound financial management, and long-term planning for reliable water service.

NON-POTABLE IRRIGATION WATER SUPPLY UPDATE

Due to ongoing drought conditions and historically low irrigation water supplies across northern Colorado, North Weld County Water District will temporarily transition affected non-potable irrigation systems to potable (treated) water as available non-potable supplies become depleted. Potable water is more costly to treat and deliver and therefore, the District will increase your irrigation rate from \$1.50 per 1,000 gallons to \$5.19 per 1,000 gallons during the period potable water is used. This temporary change applies only to customers receiving non-potable irrigation service. Customers receiving standard potable water service are not affected by this transition.

Letters have already been mailed to all affected customers with information, including details regarding the temporary transition and applicable rates. We encourage customers to use water efficiently by following the voluntary watering guidelines and reducing unnecessary outdoor water use whenever possible.
